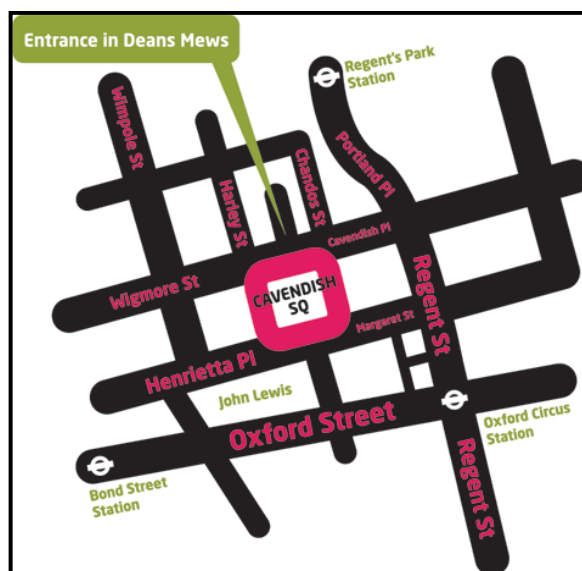

	<p>Aims of this Senate Forum</p> <p>Expanding and strengthening out of hospital care is one of the most important enablers for delivering high quality, sustainable health and care services over the coming years. The NHS Five Year Forward View highlights the benefits a coordinated multidisciplinary approach can have on patient outcomes and system resilience, and efficiency. The pressure on the NHS over the Christmas and New Year period illustrates the need for pace in redesigning out of hospital care. This meeting aims to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Emphasise the critical role of out of hospital care in responding to current system challenges and delivering Sustainability and Transformation Plans 2. Share a range of initiatives to enhance and expand care out of hospital and explore approaches, lessons learnt, benefits and impact 3. Identify common features of successful change and examples of innovation that could be adopted more widely to support whole system sustainability and transformation

9.20	<p>Session 1 : Transforming London’s health and care systems</p> <p>Dr Vin Diwakar, Medical Director, NHS England London Region</p> <p><i>Vin will set the scene for the Forum’s discussions by reflecting on some of the main drivers and opportunities for expanding and enhancing care out of hospital, which include tackling current system pressures, particularly in urgent and emergency care, as well as enabling wider transformation of health and care systems in the context of the FYFV. He will note the relative responsibilities of system partners in making the FYFY happen, with an increasing focus on supporting delivery of Sustainability and Transformation Plans (STPs), of which out of hospital care is a core part, and will describe how transformation and improvement programmes need to work effectively together and across the system to ensure a coordinated and cohesive approach.</i></p> <p>Q&A</p>
9.40	<p>Session 2 Chair: Jane Clegg</p> <p>Transforming out of hospital care in practice: learning from developments taking place across London</p> <p><i>This session will focus on sharing a range of out of hospital initiatives and will give participants the opportunity to explore approaches, impact and learning. This will involve presenting and discussing initiatives in groups at tables.</i></p> <p><i>This session will raise awareness of different initiatives, stimulate thinking about how learning could be applied elsewhere and help identify and spread innovation.</i></p> <p><i>The list of initiatives will be confirmed in advance of the meeting. There will be two rounds of discussion: 9.45-10.20am and 10.25-11.00am.</i></p>

The greatest opportunities for developing out of hospital care in your STP area and what would enable this most of all</i> <i>2. Particular themes of innovation from earlier discussions and how they can be promoted and adopted more widely</i> <i>3. What support would add most value in implementation of plans to expand and enhance out of hospital care in your STP area</i> <p><i>Each group will be asked to record key points.</i></p>
